BALI POST- CONFERENCE TRIP

1 - 5 MAY, 2026

FRIDAY, 1 MAY 2026

Day 1 – Welcome to Bali

Afternoon arrival to Ngurah Rai International Airport (DPS), Denpasar and private transfer to Hyatt Regency Bali, a 5* hotel in Sanur area. A warm *selamat datang* to the Island of the Gods – take a moment to enjoy the beautiful view and sea breeze, settle in, and refresh.

Evening: Welcome Dinner at Hyatt Regency Bali with Mrs. Ni Luh Putu Putri Suastini, spouse of the Governor of Bali and Chairwoman of the Regional Crafts Council.

SATURDAY, 2 MAY 2026

Day 2 – Gianyar and Ubud

After breakfast, depart for Gianyar, a regency celebrated for its artisan villages and living craft traditions, then continue to *Rumah Luwih* for “*Women in Textile Art*,” a presentation and trunk show by Dr. Tjokorda Istri Ratna C.S. (Bali Institute of the Arts, Denpasar), followed by a curated textile bazaar featuring local weavers and artisans; lunch will be served at *Rumah Luwih* overlooking the coast.

In the afternoon, travel to Ubud, the cultural heart of Bali, known for its temple courtyards, gallery-lined streets, and artist communities shaped by royal patronage and modern Indonesian art movements; visit the NEKA Art Museum in Sanggingan to view its renowned collections of Balinese classical paintings and modern art pieces by pioneering Indonesian and foreign artists who made Bali their home. As evening approaches, return to Sanur for dinner on the beach.



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SUNDAY, 3 MAY 2026

Day 3 – Karangasem

After breakfast at the hotel, we'll head East to the Bali Aga village of Tenganan Pegringsingan to explore its traditional compounds and the renowned "double ikat" weaving traditions. What makes this tradition so compelling is its rarity and precision: both the warp and weft threads are tie-dyed with natural dyes in intricate patterns and must align perfectly on the loom, a painstaking process that can take months and demands exceptional skill. Because only a small number of master weavers practice it, production is limited and many textiles carry ceremonial significance, authentic pieces are scarce and command premium prices. Continue to Candi Beach Resort for a leisurely seaside lunch, then visit the 18th-century Kerta Gosa (Judicial Court) at the Klungkung Palace to admire its historic architecture and painted ceilings. Return to your hotel to have free time at leisure: treat yourself to a Balinese massage, relax by the pool, or enjoy shopping and café-hopping around town.

MONDAY, 4 MAY 2026

Day 4 – Tabanan and Kerambitan Royal Palace

Visit *Tanah Lot*, one of Bali's most revered sea temples, dramatically perched on an offshore rock along the Tabanan coast. The complex is famed for its ocean vistas and tide-dependent access, offering a vivid glimpse into Bali's coastal spirituality. Continue to Elyseum, Luna Beach Club for lunch, with buggy transportation around the Art Park, followed by High Tea at Elyseum (speaker TBA). For ladies wishing to transition from daywear to elegant evening attire, spacious restrooms are available for changing and preparation. Conclude the day with a Gala & Farewell Dinner at Kerambitan Royal Palace (*Puri Anyar Kerambitan*), the historic royal residence of the former Tabanan kingdom, renowned for its traditional courtyards, carved gateways, and living cultural traditions. Upon entering the palace, all guests are required to wear a sash around the waist, these will be provided. The evening features an authentic Balinese cultural program with a welcome dance, live music, a staged Balinese wedding, a guided palace tour, dinner, and a theatrical performance by the local community.

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TUESDAY, 5 MAY 2026

Day 5 – Good Bye Bali

After breakfast, check out of the hotel and transfer to Denpasar airport. As you depart, may you carry home beautiful memories of Indonesia, its landscapes, culture, and hospitality, and may the friendships and spirit of sisterhood forged on this 17th Biennial Conference continue to inspire you long after you return! *Sampai jumpa lagi*, 'till we meet again!
