The Program was interesting and inspiring, and WCI did a very good job of planning. Meeting the attendees from all over the world was one of the highlights of the conference.

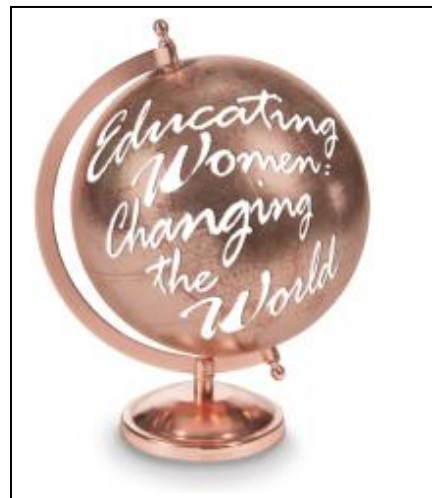

I learned about the magazine *theLINK*, which I never have seen before because I don't attend a lot of the regular meetings in our club. It was suggested that we get a link from our website directly to *theLINK* Magazine. If so, maybe more people would read it.

There was also a discussion about if maybe we should add information about the various clubs in this magazine to make it more interesting. We were also discussing whether or how this magazine could inspire us in our work to **educate women**. It was believed that the way we publish and promote the Link Magazine was not enough for members read it.

At the Board of Directors meeting (not the full meeting) Linda and I were invited to join. We introduced our club and talked about our programs and activities, number of members, and how much money we raised since the start of 1992. At this meeting every club had an opportunity to do a 3-minute Presentation.

At the round table discussion, we probably had 10 tables with 8 people at each table. We were given information and a lesson about Skype. Maria Fernanda Arduino brought up our club as an example of how Skype was used when the Baku club was visiting us.

The emphasis for the round table discussions was really on **education**, which was what the Magazine *theLINK* also was reflecting. The slogan was:

“Friendship Through Understanding and Understanding Through Friendship”

1. What do you understand by WCI initiative: Educating Women?
2. How do you suggest this initiative should be put into practice?
3. What does your Club do with respect to the education of women?
